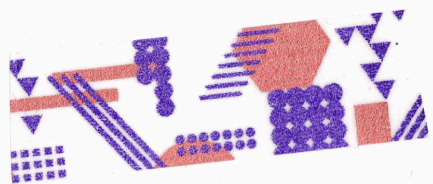

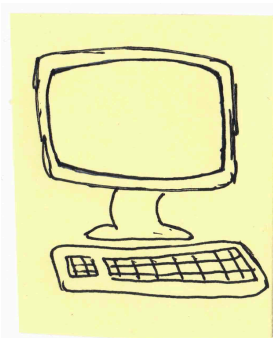

posted was wrong.

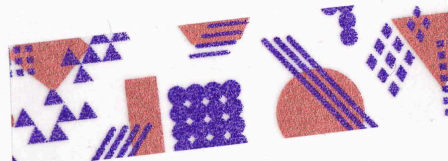
QUIET
